The Institute's Organisation



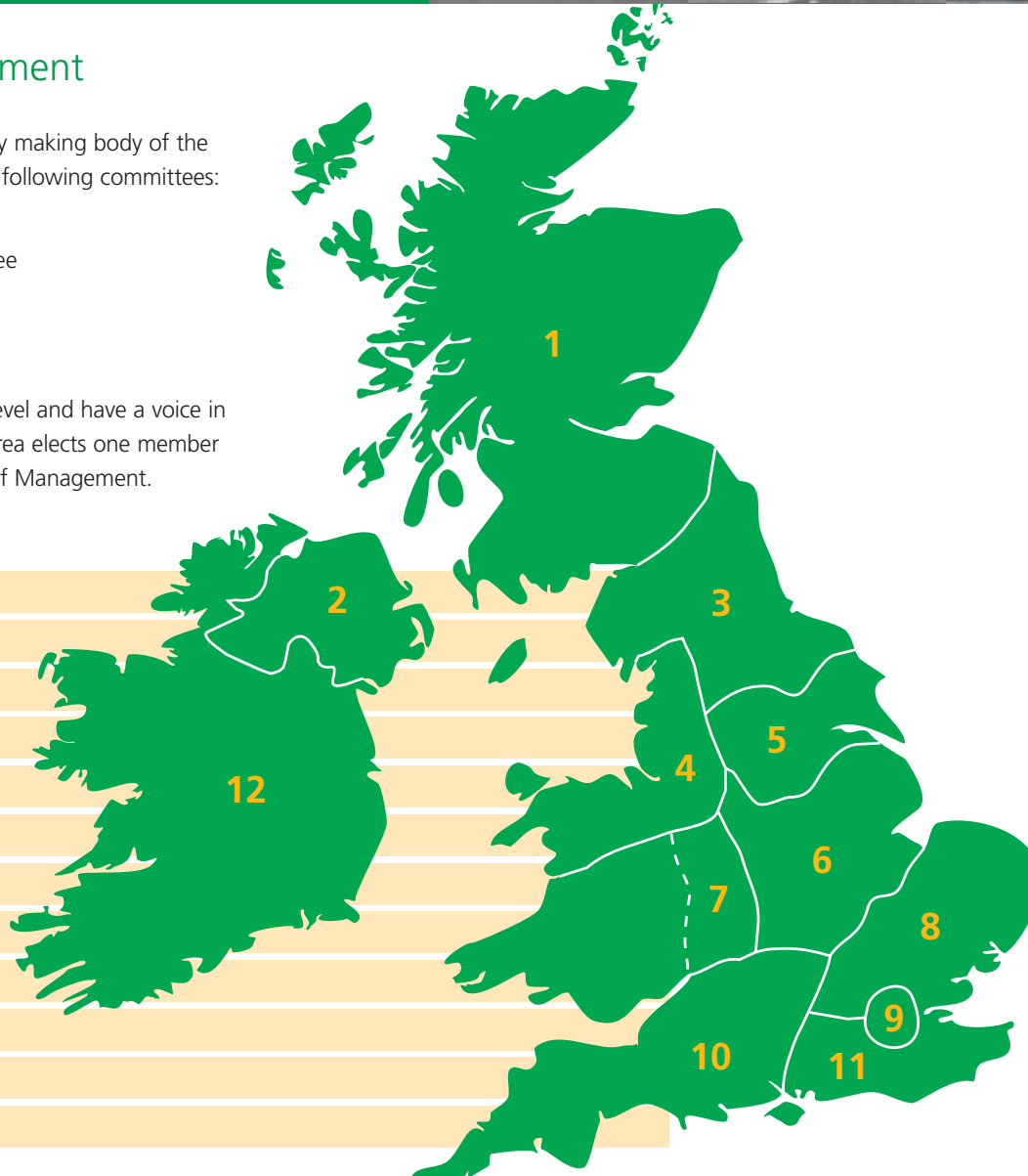
The Council of Management
